



How to View Your KCU Course Schedule for Fall 2020

1. **Log on to your student portal by typing my.kcu.edu into the address bar at the top of your web browser.**

Your username is typically the first part of your kcu.edu email address. Your login is likely some combination of your first initial, middle initial, and whole last name. Use the first part of your KCU email address `studentname@kcu.edu`

For example, my log in is *eamiller*

Your password is your eight-digit birthday `MMDDYYYY`.

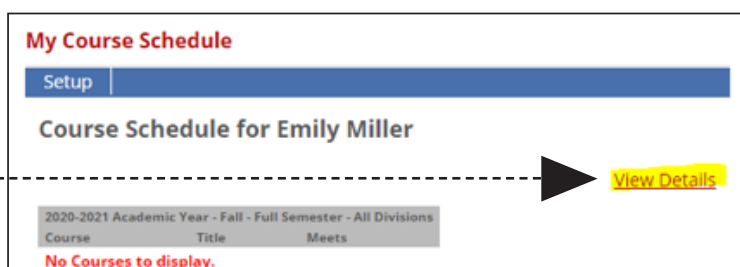
For example, if my birthday is January 1, 2000, my password would be `01012000`.

*It's easier to log in from a computer at the beginning but once you know your way around the portal you will be able to easily use your smart phone.

2. **Click on Student at the top of the page:**

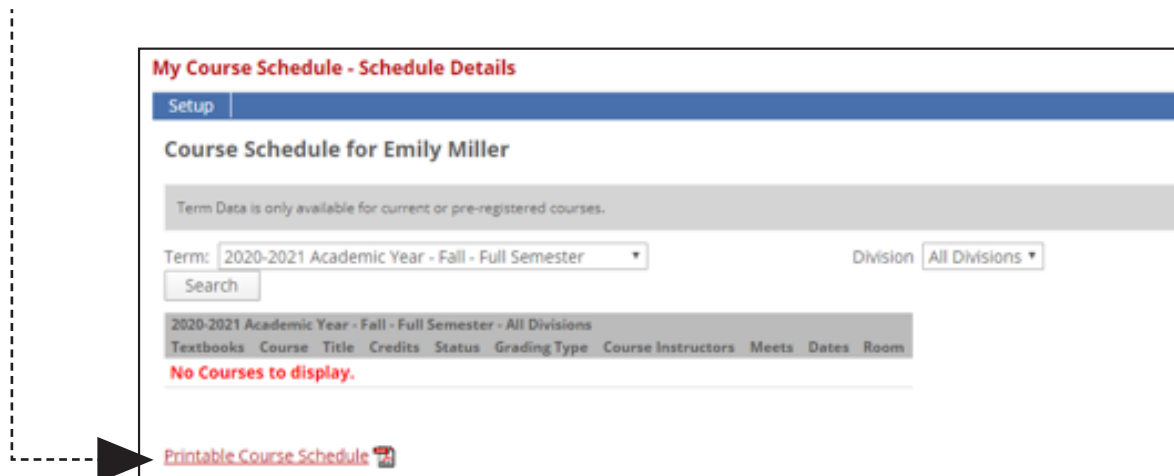


3. **In the bottom right hand corner click on "View Details"**

Frequently Asked Questions:

- 14-15 hours is a normal freshman semester. You need to average 15 hours a semester for 8 semesters to graduate with 120 hours.
- MWF=Monday, Wednesday, and Friday and TR=Tuesday and Thursday
- We only have one section of most classes at KCU. Our classes are held from 8:00am-2:50pm Monday-Friday and 6:30pm-9:15pm on Monday and Thursdays. Athletic practices are scheduled around class schedules so don't worry about the two conflicting.
- Nursing and Biology Majors are required to have a 21 ACT score to take the first course in the major. You may be labeled as undeclared if you don't have the needed score. You can retake the ACT to improve your score.
- All students are required to take BOT 110 Intro to Old Testament in their first semester at KCU.
- If you have below a 21 on the Reading subscore on the ACT you were placed into BOT 111 Intro to Old Testament Reading lab to help you improve your reading skills so that you can be successful in college. You will have the opportunity to test out of the lab during the first week of class.

PROGRAMS OF STUDY

Kentucky Christian University offers five undergraduate degrees: the Bachelor of Arts (B.A.), the Bachelor of Science (B.S.), the Bachelor of Business Administration (B.B.A.), the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (B.S.N.), and the Bachelor of Social Work (B.S.W.). Within each of the bachelor's level programs, students will complete a core curriculum of 31 hours in General Education, a minimum of 12 hours in Bible, and at least a 30-hour major.

Bachelor's degrees are designed to prepare students for careers and graduate study in a variety of specialized areas. 12 hours of language study are required for the Bachelor of Arts degree.

Minors: A minor consists of a minimum of 18 semester hours. Each academic department must approve the curriculum to be used in the completion of each minor. No more than six hours may be used to satisfy both the requirements of a minor and the requirements of a major. Specific requirements for minors are described under the appropriate academic program.
