

Conditions for Receiving Financial Aid

Please take note of the following:

1. The most recent Financial Aid Offer supersedes any previous offer(s) you received. Please be sure to review and accept/decline each of the items in your Financial Aid Offer on the my.KCU.edu portal (under My Financial Aid). If you have any questions or issues with the portal, please contact the Financial Aid Office at 606-474-3226 or via email at finaid@kcu.edu.
2. Your Financial Aid Offer will not be disbursed until AFTER you choose to accept/decline each of the items in your Financial Aid Offer and AFTER the last day to add/drop classes for the semester.
3. Students are required to notify the Financial Aid Office in writing regarding any changes in their financial or academic status while attending Kentucky Christian University.
4. Financial aid funds are disbursed based on your enrollment on the last day to add/drop classes. Aid is credited to the student's account at the University on a semester-by-semester basis.
5. Students participating in the work-study program will receive paychecks twice a month (12th & 26th) for work-study earnings. You must visit the Financial Aid Office before beginning work to receive a job assignment and complete the necessary employment forms.
6. Students will be required to complete Entrance Counseling, a Master Promissory Note, and an Annual Student Loan Acknowledgement at www.studentaid.gov if they receive a Direct Subsidized or Unsubsidized Loan. This should be completed before the student's registration day. Upon graduation or withdrawal from KCU, they will also be required to complete Exit Counseling.
7. You are not obligated to accept the full loan amounts listed on your Financial Aid Offer. You have the right to decline or reduce the amount of your loan by making a change on your portal or by contacting the Financial Aid Office.
8. To continue receiving aid, a student must maintain academic progress as defined in the University's Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) guidelines and must be pursuing a degree.
9. Students must reapply for aid each academic year by filing a new Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at StudentAid.gov.
10. We reserve the right to modify your Financial Aid Offer at any time due to changes in your enrollment status, your financial aid eligibility, or the availability of our funding.
11. Any aid from external resources must be taken into consideration in evaluating your financial need. Outside resources received by the University during the academic year that were not considered when the Financial Aid Offer was made may result in necessary changes to your financial aid package.
12. Please understand that if you withdraw from the University, your offers will be revised or canceled depending on the last date of academic activity and the final costs for the enrollment period you attended. You will be responsible for all charges that you have incurred.
